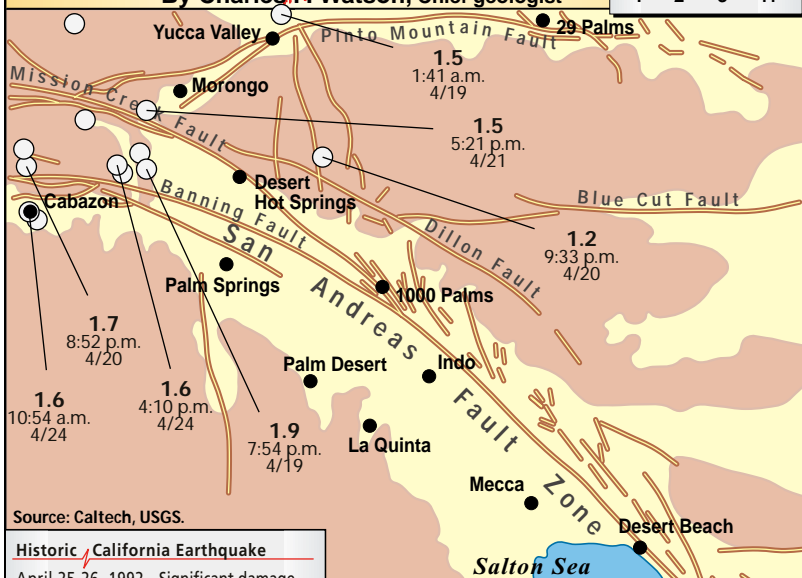


The Coachella Valley Earthquake Report

April 18 - 24, 2002

- ▼ After falling to the second fewest in 20 years, earthquake activity in the greater Coachella Valley region jumped from the previous week, producing 13 events – the most in eleven weeks. It was the first double-digit total in four weeks and only the second in ten weeks.
- ▼ The intensity of seismicity remained relaxed as no action measured in the M 2.0 range. It has been eleven weeks since the last M 3.0+ event struck the region and the gap between M 4.0+ quake increased to 154 weeks (two weeks shy of three years).
- ▼ Most of the activity occurred in the foothills to the San Bernardino Mountains west of Desert Hot Springs and north of Cabazon. The largest quake measured M 1.9 and was part of a four-event sequence in the Whitewater Canyon area near the fish hatchery. Two triggered close to Cabazon (largest: M 1.6) and two others happened slightly to the north (largest: M 1.7).
